ISO 45001 IS THE INTERNATIONAL STANDARD FOR OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS.

Recently audited by <u>Bureau Veritas</u>, MAK Water is pleased to announce that it has gained <u>ISO</u> <u>45001</u> Occupational Health & Safety Management System certification, in addition to existing <u>ISO</u> <u>9001</u> Quality Management System certification.
